YEAR 5 EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO WINCHCOMBE RAILWAY STATION

On Tuesday 15th September, Year 5 children visited Winchcombe Railway Station to learn more about evacuation during World War 2 for their topic, "Blitz and Pieces". The children (and adults!) enjoyed dressing up as evacuees and stepping back in time to 1939 when the war had just begun.

During the day, they learnt about why evacuees were evacuated and where they were evacuated to - experiencing an exciting ride on a steam train and speaking to people who were real evacuees during World War 2. Singing songs such as "Run Rabbit Run" got us into the spirit of things, as did sitting in complete darkness in an Anderson shelter when the air raid siren went off!

"It was a real experience going on the steam train - there was a German spy on the train!" Freya 5SS.

"It was really fun. My favourite bit was when we went on the steam train" Jakub 5MC.

YEAR 6 EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO WINCHCOMBE RAILWAY STATION

It is important that pupils are accompanied (adults are welcome too!) There will be a charge of £1.00 to help to cover costs, and there will be refreshments available to buy during the break.

GOOD TO BE GREEN [GTBG] BEHAVIOUR SYSTEM

Today the children in Years 1 to 6 heard all about this year's GTBG behaviour and reward systems, which the School Council have been involved in.

1. A child persistently receiving amber warning cards, 3 or more cards weekly over a two week period, will be referred to the Pastoral Leader (Mrs Stack) by the Class Teacher and Parents will be informed.
2. The reward system this year will be coloured wristbands which have been personalised to our school and will be a different colour each term - red, orange, yellow, green, blue and violet.
3. We recognise that, from time to time, children may make the wrong choice and therefore a child will still receive a termly reward (the appropriate coloured wristband) if they remain green for the term or if they have received one or two amber warning cards in that term.
4. If a child has stayed 'green' (i.e. has not received any amber or red cards) all academic year then s/he will be awarded a rainbow coloured wristband at the end of the school year.

This new system is effective from Monday 21st September; therefore any children who have received an amber or red card to date will be given a fresh start so that they can aspire to receiving a red wristband.

Children in RJB and RLW will spend the Autumn terms settling in and understanding the language of the behaviour system. They will join the reward system in January. A letter will go out to parents of children in RJB and RLW once the behaviour system has been introduced to the children.
