



St. Peter's Catholic Primary School
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Pupil Premium Report 2011 - 2012

Pupil premium is given to schools by the Government to support children who are in receipt of free school meals, children who are in care and children of Service families. The amount of pupil premium funding that has been received for 2011-2012 is £17,280.

At St. Peter's Catholic Primary School:-

- 13.7% of pupils received free school meals in one or more of the last 6 years
- 0.2 % of pupils were children in care
- 0.5% of pupils were children of Service families

The Department for Education states that, "It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium, allocated to schools per FSM pupil, is spent, since they are best placed to access what additional provision should be made for individual pupils."

How St. Peter's Catholic Primary School uses the money

At St. Peter's, the pupil premium has funded a number of activities and interventions to support pupil progress and attainment. These have included:

- Development of interventions relating to maths and literacy skills.
- One to One tuition from qualified teachers.
- Increased TA hours to lead on Social Skills groups.
- Increased TA hours to lead on 'chatter' groups.
- Fun Club early morning focused activities.
- Pastoral leader support to families and pupils.

Measuring the Impact of the Pupil Premium

Data collected from Summer Term Assessments 2012 show that:

- In year progress for KS1 FSM/E6 pupils was GOOD in Maths, SATISFACTORY in writing and OUTSTANDING in Reading.
- At the end of KS1 FSM girls were underperforming inline with their peers in Maths.
- The percentage of FSM/E6 pupils achieving Level 4 or above at the end of KS2 was 100% in English, Maths and English and Maths combined.

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
