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Pupil Premium Statement 2012 - 2013

Pupil premium is given to schools by the Government to support children who are in receipt of free school meals, children who are in care and children of Service families. The amount of pupil premium funding received for 2012-2013 was £36,884.

The breakdown of Pupil Premium entitlement for the academic year was:

- 13.7% of pupils received free school meals in one or more of the last 6 years
- 0.2 % of pupils were children in care
- 0.5% of pupils were children of Service families

The Department for Education states that, "It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to access what additional provision should be made for individual pupils."

How St. Peter's Catholic Primary School Uses The Pupil Premium

At St. Peter's, the pupil premium has funded a number of activities and interventions to raise the aspirations and educational outcomes of those children entitled to this funding in the academic year 2012 - 2013. These have included:

- Development of interventions relating to maths and literacy skills.
- One to One and small group tuition from qualified teachers.
- Increased TA hours to lead on Social Skills groups.
- Increased TA hours to lead on 'chatter' groups.
- Fun Club early morning focused activities.
- Subsidising fully or in part school trips or out of school activities for eligible pupils.
- Pastoral leader support to families and pupils – leading on CAFs, signposting parents to support networks and websites, informing parents of grants they may be entitled to enable them to access additional funding, accessing active involvement of other professionals etc.

Measuring the Impact of the Pupil Premium

KS1 data (Summer Term 2013) show that:

- 86% of FSM/E6 pupils attained L2b+ in Reading, Writing and Maths.
- 43% of FSM/E6 pupils attained a L3 in Reading.
- 29% of FSM/E6 pupils attained a L3 in Writing.
- 14% of FSM/E6 pupils attained a L3 in Maths.

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KS2 data (Summer term 2013) shows that:

- 100% of FSM/E6 pupils attained L4+ in Reading, of which 17% attained a L5.
- 100% of FSM/E6 pupils made 2 levels progress in Reading.

- 92% of FSM/E6 pupils attained L4+ in Writing, of which 8% attained a L5.
- 92% of FSM/E6 pupils made 2 levels progress in Writing.

- 50% of FSM/E6 pupils attained L4+ in Maths, of which 8% attained a L5.
