To be successful...

Feature	Example
Capital letters and full stops	
Second person	... <u>you</u> need to put on ...
Present tense	Carefully <u>place</u> the iPod speaker ...
Imperative verbs	<u>Climb</u> above ... <u>Build</u> up ...
Cohesive devices - pronouns, synonyms, conjunctions, adverbials of time and number	<u>Firstly</u> , you need to <u>its</u> back <u>so</u> ... <u>but</u> ... <u>because</u> ...

Adverbials of time and number

We can use adverbs or adverbials to link between sentences.

To begin	To start	Firstly
After that	Secondly	Then
Now	Lastly	Finally

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Adverbs

An adverb is simply a word that describes a verb (an action or a doing word).

Cleverly	Clearly	Diligently
Swiftly	Tenderly	Tightly
Cautiously	Generously	Instantly
Stealthily	Rapidly	Regularly

Imperative verbs

An imperative verb tells someone to do something.

Follow	Place	Cut
Repeat	Prepare	Jump
Add	Apply	Lead
Wait	Sit	Stand
