Dear parents and carers,

Thank you for support following the lockdown procedure yesterday. The police visited us at school and advised us to put temporary additional measures in place. Staff responded superbly. It is always a priority to keep staff and children safe. Hopefully most children are unaware that action was taken as they largely continued the school day as normal. We will continue with some additional measures, such as increased senior leader presence at entry points, for the foreseeable future.

Please can I politely remind parents to collect their children from the classrooms at 3.15pm. We have recently seen an increase in children being collected late. This has a significant impact on staff who have training, marking and planning to complete outside of direct teaching time. I will endeavour to challenge parents who regularly do not collect their child promptly at 3.15pm. This does not apply to <u>the vast majority of</u> parents. I appreciate that there occasionally may be factors outside of our control and any one of us may be late as a result. This could happen to any of us. However, there are <u>a number of</u> children who are regularly being collected late.

I am delighted to launch the new Pokémon Club for Key Stage 2 later today. I have absolutely no idea what I am doing (don't tell the kids) but I have managed to buy and acquire a range of cards to support the club. A small number of children are <u>really keen</u> to attend the club but do not have any cards. If you happen to have any old cards at home which are no longer used, then please could I kindly ask you to consider donating them to the school. I would be extremely grateful if any card donations could be shared at the school office.

We will be having a non-school uniform day on **Friday 14th March**. Children are welcome to wear their own clothes and are encouraged to wear yellow (for St. David's day) and/ or green (for St. Patrick's day). The suggested contribution is £1 per family and this money will be split equally between Mission Together and the new St. Peter's Catholic Primary School Fund for Disadvantaged Children and Families.

The new fund is designed to provide the school with an accessible pot of money we can use to support children and families within our school community. The Pupil Premium Grant provides us with some additional funding to support those in receipt of Free School Meals, however we are seeing an increase in families, often working families, who are approaching the school for support. This fund will allow us to support any children or family in need at any time. I kindly ask everyone to consider supporting this.

As previously shared, I am also due to run the half Marathon in Madrid on Sunday 6th April 2025. Monies raised from this will also be split equally between Mission Together and the St. Peter's Disadvantaged Fund. We have managed to raise over £300 so far. I would be extremely grateful if the school community would consider donating to two very good causes:


We had the time of our lives dancing and singing.

mon birds at home the same as ours at school?


